24 Hour Adoration

We will observe our 24 hours of Eucharistic Adoration on Thursday beginning after the 6:30 A.M. Mass for All Saints Day. Adoration will be held in the Meeting Room until the Friday morning at 6 A.M. Please note: the meeting room has been equipped with a new entry method. Due to concerns raised by some who have been at Adoration in the late night/early morning hours, a new lock was installed. Simply turn the lever on the inside of the door knob to keep the door open. If you want to lock the door, reverse the lever on the inside and the door will lock. This way someone coming up to the door will have to knock and wait for the door. Should the door lock, the keypad combination this month will be 2-4-3. Punch in the numbers and the door handle will gain access.

Therefore, in order to instill responsibility by those who use the Pre-K building, a deposit of \$150 will be required when the key is picked up. On the following Monday when the key is returned the deposit will be given back as long as no damage or cleaning is needed. This is not to punish or restrict the building from being used, but rather a means to insure it being left in proper order to serve its primary purpose.
